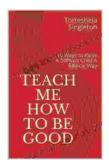
10 Ways To Raise Difficult Child Biblical Way

Don't be afraid to get help from others if you need it. Talk to your spouse, a pastor, or a Christian counselor. They can offer support and guidance.

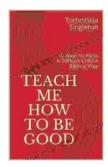
9. Remember that you are not alone.

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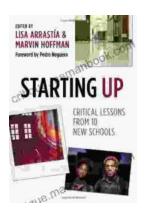
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
