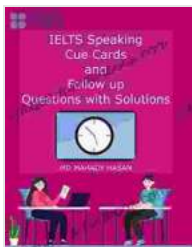


IELTS Speaking Cue Cards And Follow-Up Questions With Solutions

Describe a time when you had to overcome a challenge.

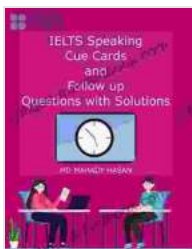
Solution

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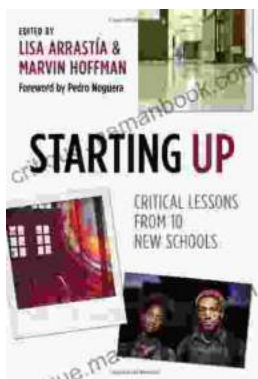
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
