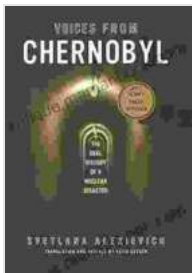


# Voices From Chernobyl: An Unforgettable Account of the Nuclear Disaster

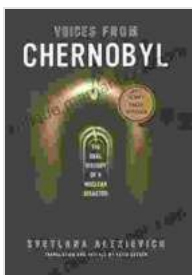

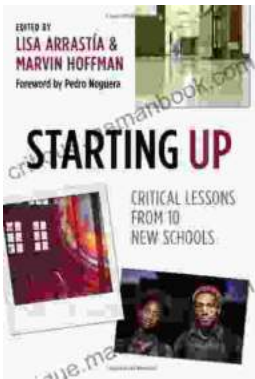
